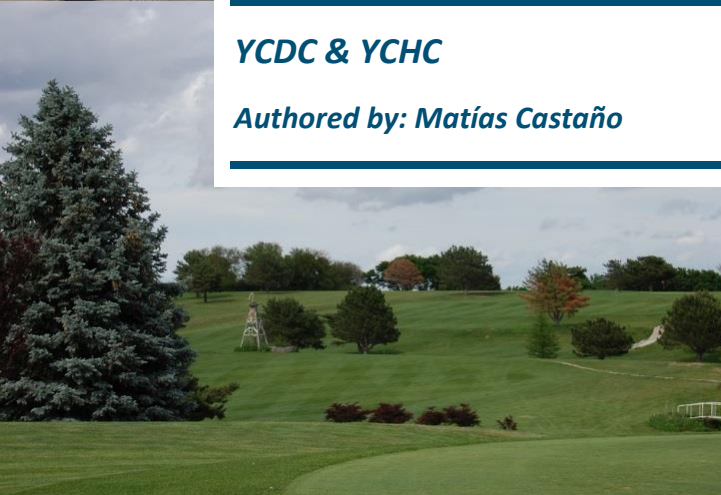

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Analysis of Food Access:

A survey conducted on York County, NE

YCDC & YCHC

In an attempt to provide future programming and grant applications to non-profit organizations in our community, York County Development Corporation (YCDC) teamed up with York County Health Coalition (YCHC) to ask the community questions regarding food access and food availability. Through the Local Foods Local Places initiative, we were able to conduct this anonymous survey for all adults who live in York County. With an end goal in mind and a little over a month of survey access to the public, we are now ready to share our professional analysis.

The survey consisted of 18 questions; 15 multiple choice and 3 being open-ended. The intended outcome of this survey was to understand the community's needs in regards for food. More specifically, food; accessibility, availability, knowledge, assistance, prefer-ability, and reliability.

We'll go through groups of questions regarding the same topic and subsequently dig into the analytics in each group. Starting with location, a little over 83% of participants of this survey find themselves attaining their food from Grocery Stores Inside of York County. The other 17% percent is distributed amongst the following categories: Grocery Stores Outside of York County (6%), Fast Food (3%), Restaurants (2%), Own Garden/Farm (2%), Food Pantry (1%), Online Food Delivery or Meals on Wheels (1%), Senior Center (1%), and Family, Friends or Church/Faith Organizations (1%).

Community gardens are a special way for interested members of the community to contribute to a healthy lifestyle by: providing fresh, safe, gratuitous herbs, fruits and vegetables.

When asked about the use of Community Gardens, 38% of participants answered "I wouldn't use a Community Garden," 31% opted for the opposite, choosing "I would use a Community Garden," and only 2% are currently using a Community Garden.

Next inquired about was the main reason behind not using a Community Garden, 30% of participants agreed on not being interested. There were a total of 40 participants who explained that they utilize their own garden and therefore, are not in need of a community garden. Other groups consisted of lack of gardening knowledge (71), lack of time (64), availability (53), and location (43).

Besides providing an extra food option in the community, these gardens also help with participant's well-being, by increasing; physical activity, physical health, and overall quality of life. Our next step is attempting to understand why a great opportunity is being squandered.

Next, we asked participants if they used the local Farmer's Market. 41% have never used the Farmer's Market, 51% sometimes use it and only 8% of participants utilize the Farmer's Market often.

Out of the 174 participants who benefit from the Farmer's Market, 24% would like to see more Fruits and Vegetables, 15% would like to see more Variety or Vendors, and the rest of the participants were dispersed amongst the following categories: Lower Prices (5%), Meat/Poultry (5%), Baked Goods (5%), Food Trucks/Entertainment (4%), Miscellaneous/NA (42%).

Of the individuals who participated in the survey, 74% don't need the help of outside resources to provide them with food. The other 26% are currently finding help in the following ways: Food Pantry, Food Stamps/SNAP/WIC, School Meals, Blue Valley Community Action, Church/Faith Organizations, York County Transportation, and the Senior Center.

More than half of the participants expressed that they've not been concerned about money for the food needed over the past year. However, 7% of participants, in the past year, have worried often about this very subject. Overpriced food, accompanied by "Unexpected Bills/Expenses" were the two highest reasons for the unease the participants had in this field.

Every city in York County was represented by at least one participant in the survey, with the majority being from York and age groups falling in between 18 to over 85 years old. The study also showed that 39% of participants personally know, or know of, someone in York County who at times, don't have enough food. The remaining 61% is almost equally divided between those who don't know of anyone with this endeavor (31%), and those who are not sure (30%).

We asked the participants if they had any ideas for the solution of this problem in our county. A few comments were mentioned multiple times. One of those being better advertising; of the already existing help and the available employment opportunities as well. Transportation to and from grocery stores, either bus transport or community volunteers. More food options; sit-in restaurants and healthier grocery stores. Also mentioned multiple times, was the idea of having a course that people in the community could take to learn how to save money and how to plant foods for their own consumption.

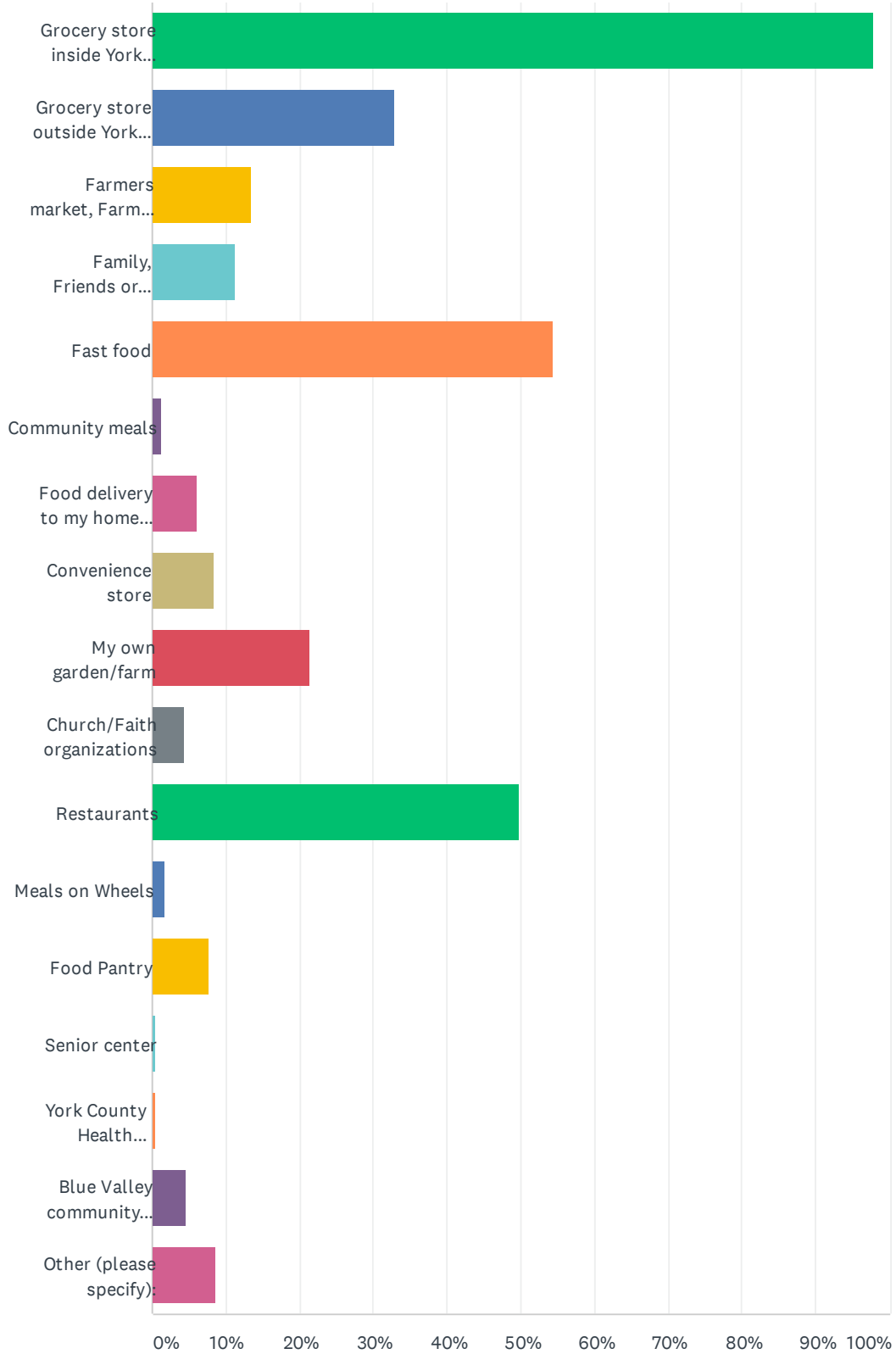
We've conducted this Food Access survey with hopes of understanding the food needs of our community. With this information, we are closer to providing non-profit organizations in York County with future programming and grant applications.

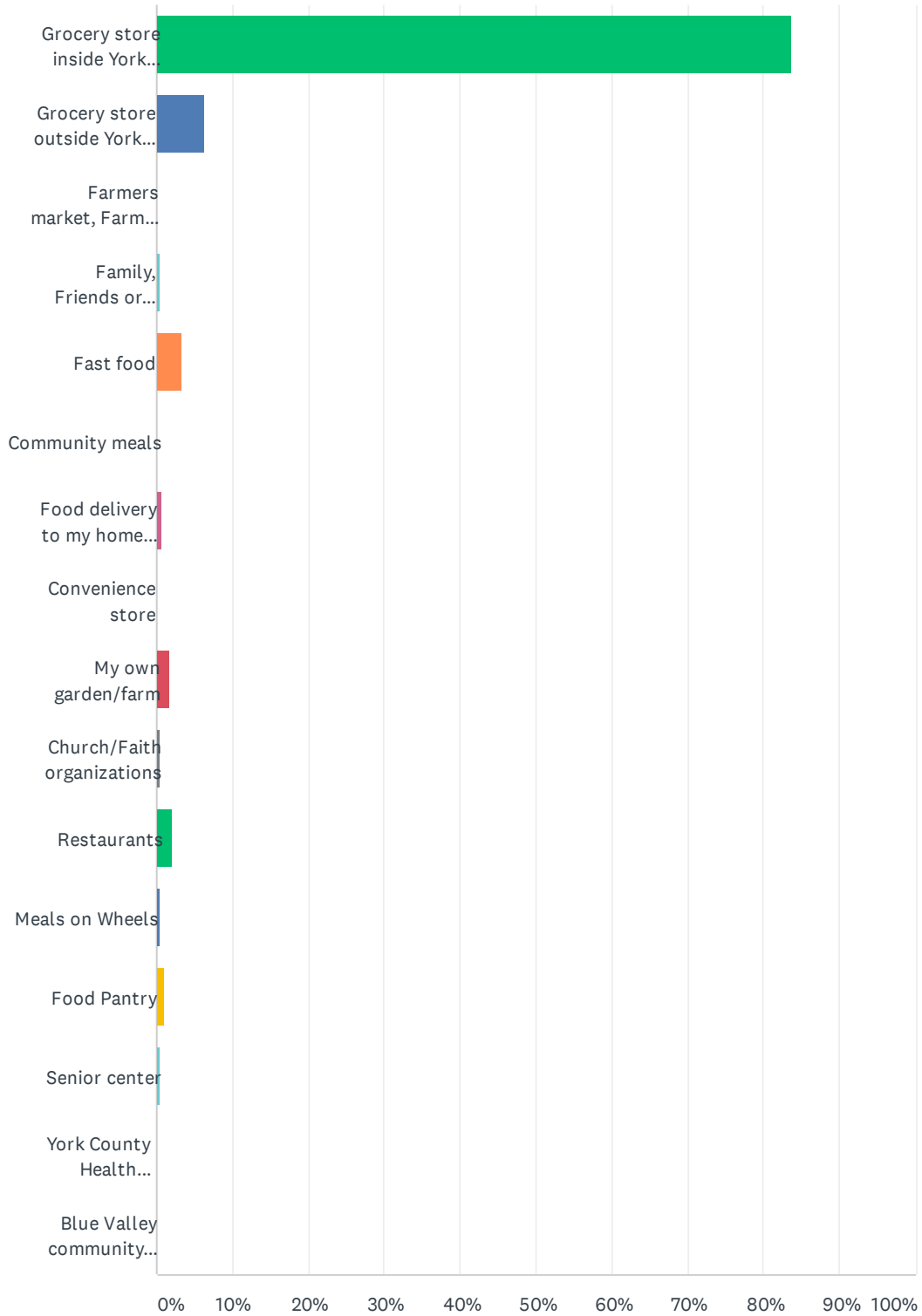

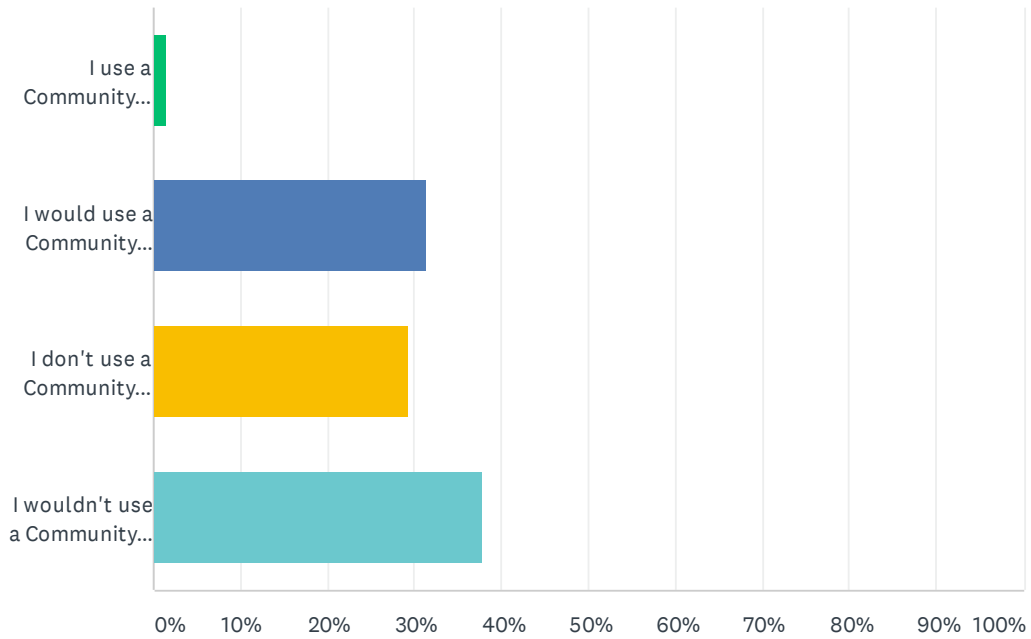

Q3 Do you utilize a Community Garden or would you?

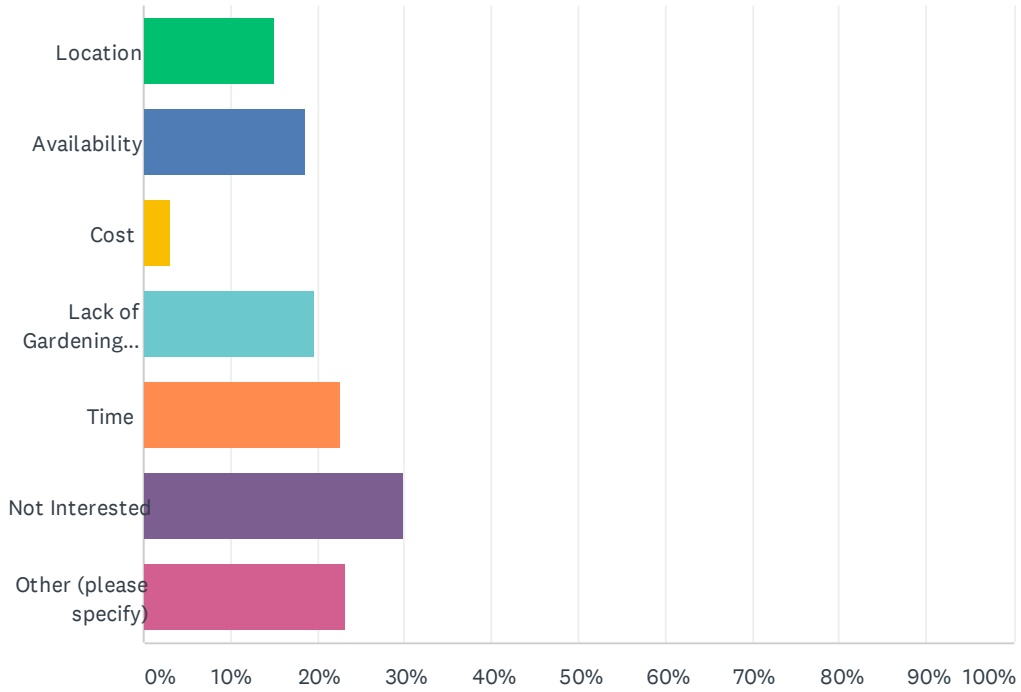

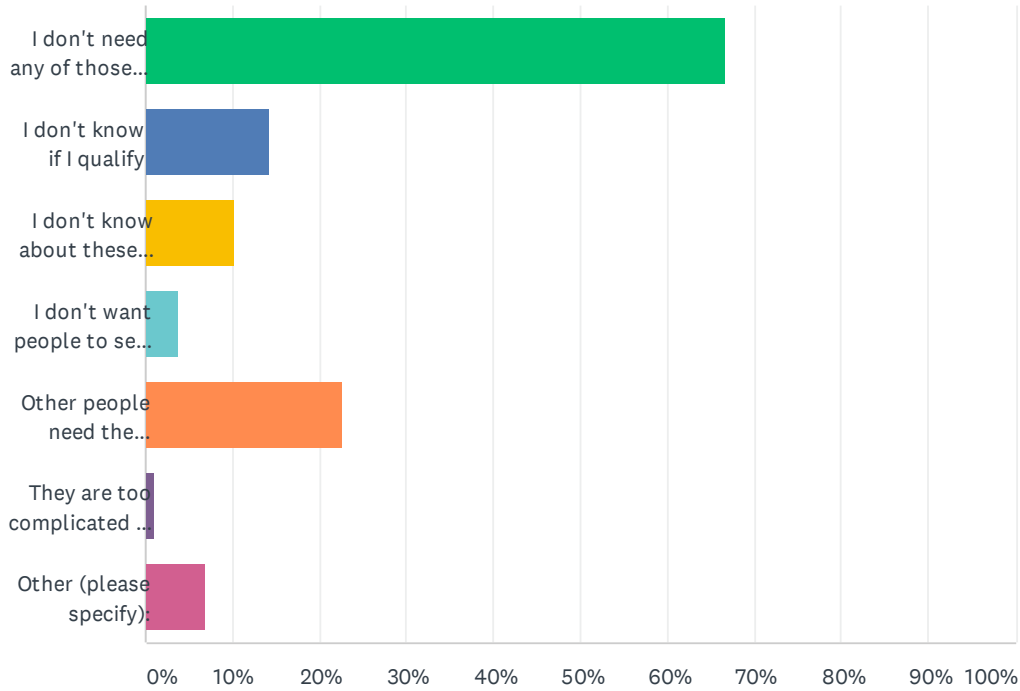

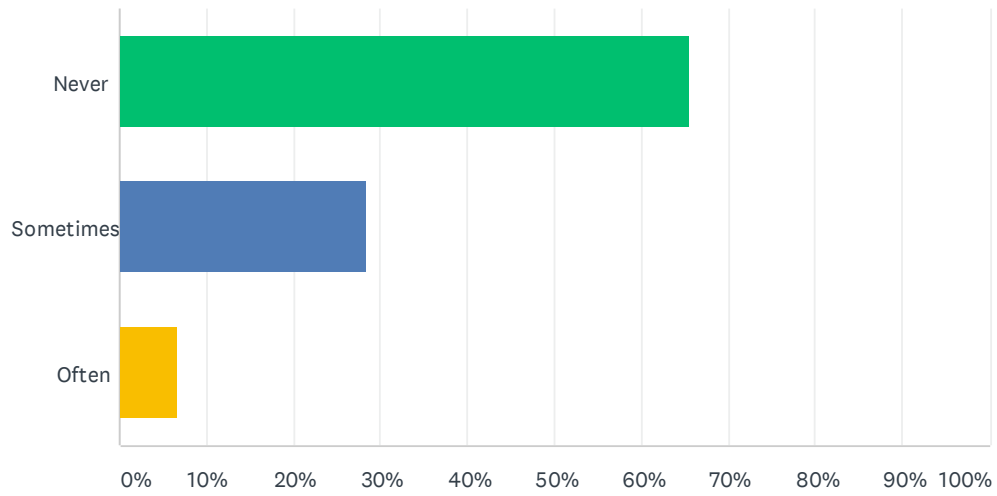

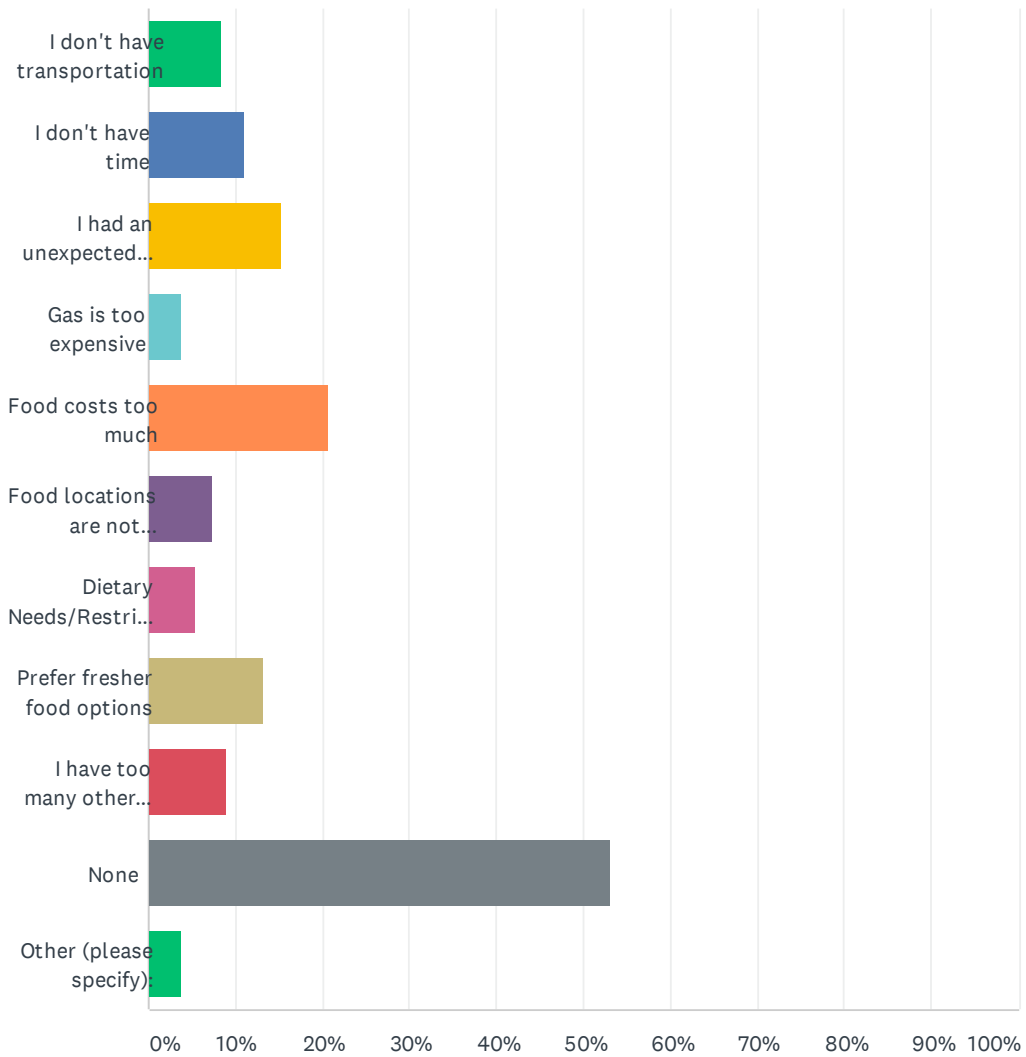

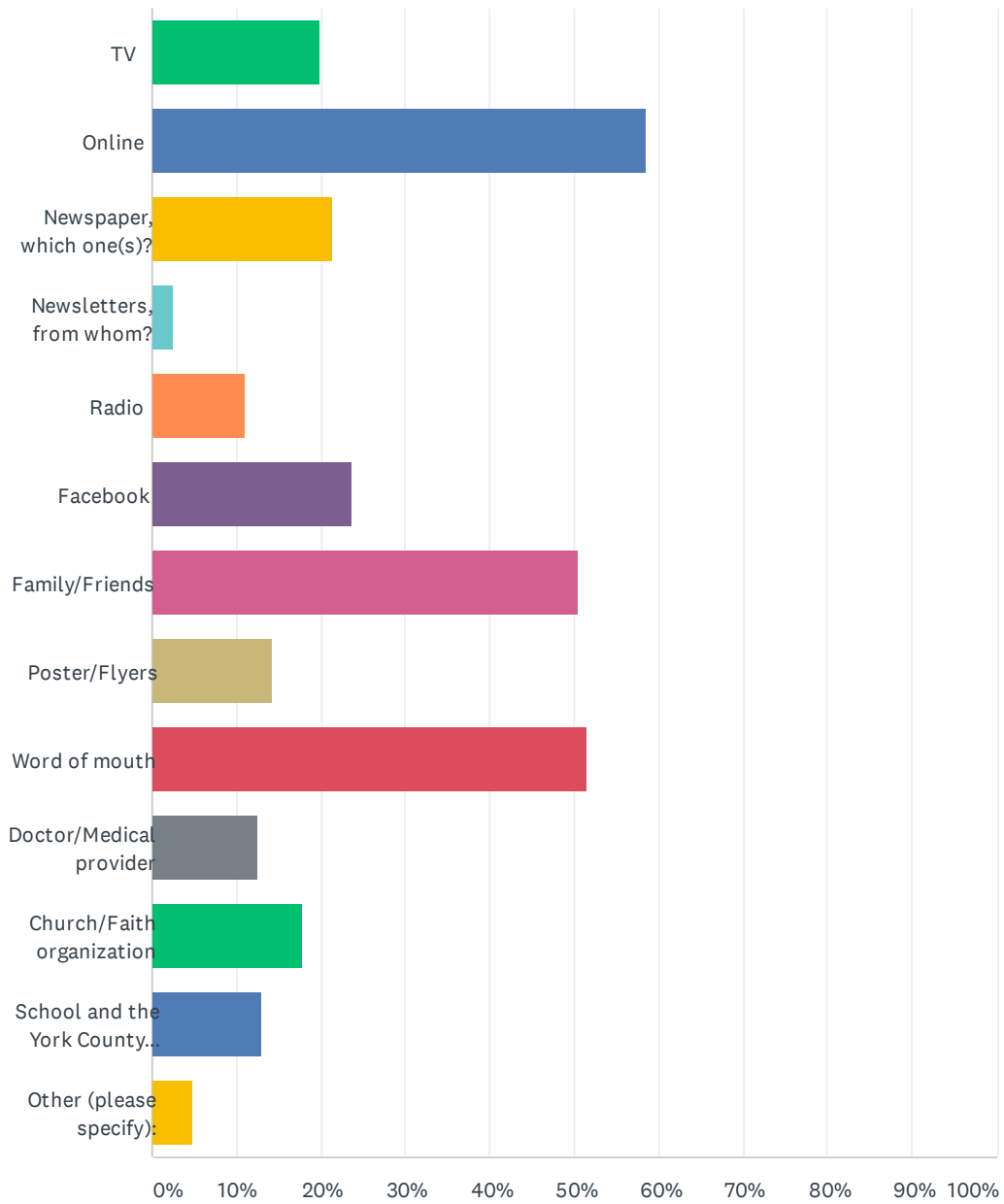

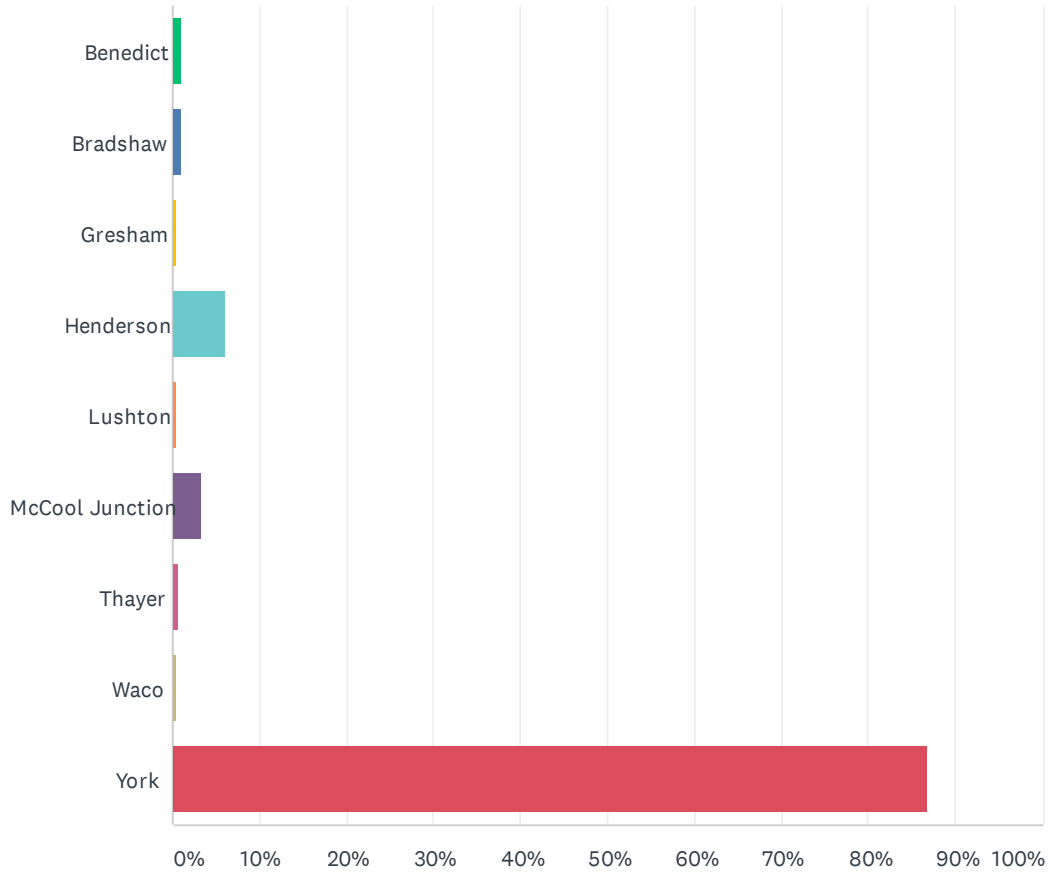

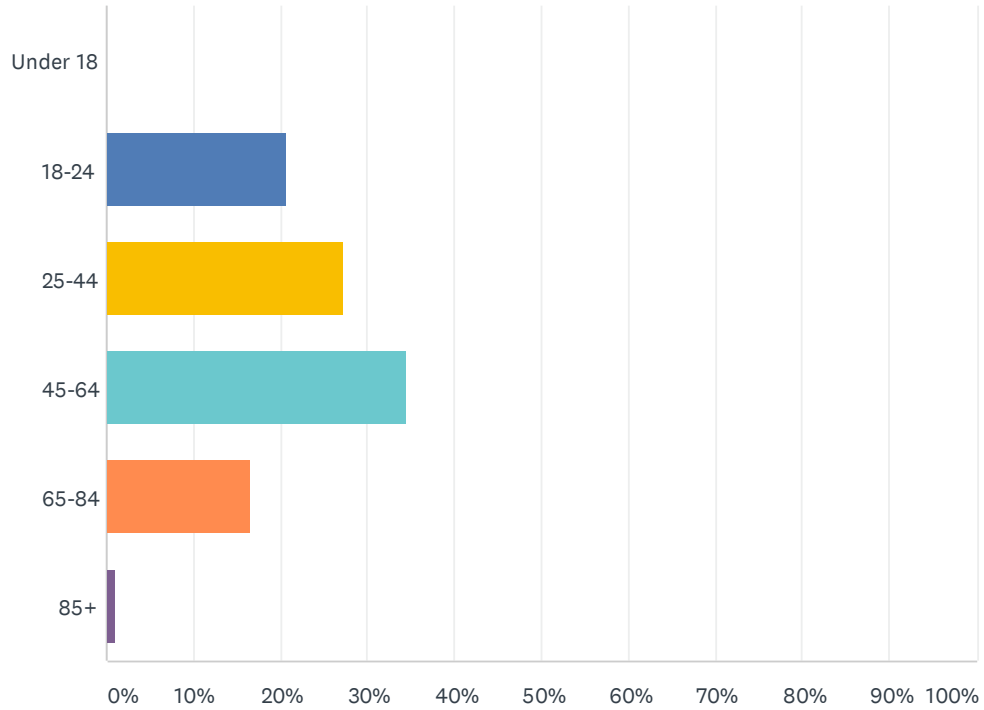

Q14 What's your age?

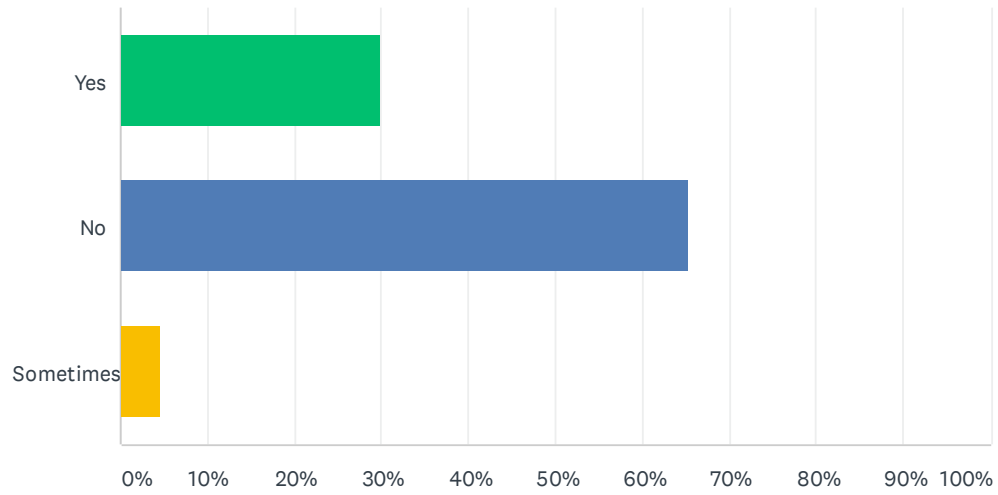

Q15 Do you have any children who depend on you to provide their food?

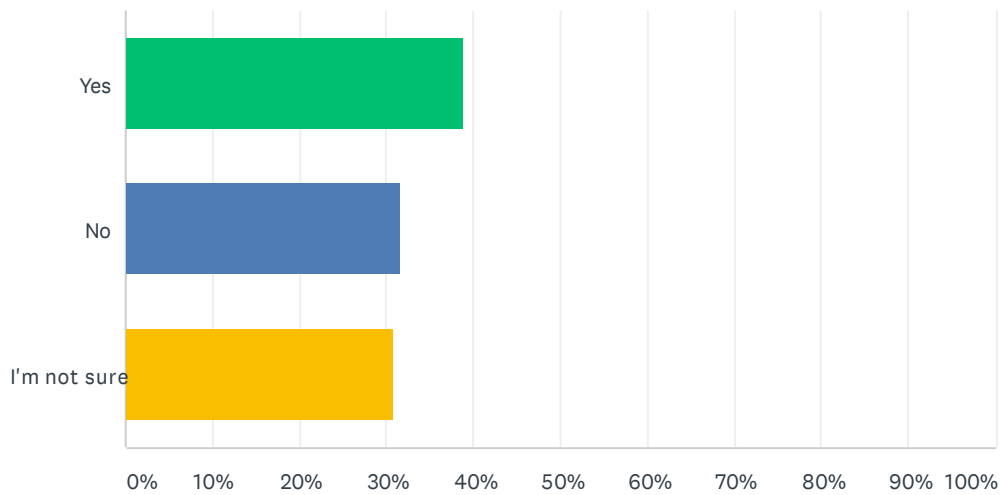
